Student Transportation Services of York Region (STSYR) provides an annual report to the Joint Board Consortium, summarizing the September Start-up process.

Background:

The September Start Up period experienced service successes along with a few challenges due to the ongoing province-wide driver shortage, as well as traffic and construction projects.

On-time Service Delivery:

Province-wide Driver Challenges:

School bus operators throughout the province continue to experience challenges in hiring and retaining drivers. For the 2023-24 school year, the Ministry of Education announced changes to

Traffic and Construction:
